

A Prophet Like Unto Me

Moses prophesied that a future prophet like unto himself would be sent by God (Deuteronomy 18:15) not only to Israel, but to the whole world. As Moses was used to deliver the Jews out of Egypt, Jesus would come and deliver all of His people throughout the world, both Jew and Gentile, from out of the clutches of the Devil who is the god of this world (2Corinthians 4:3-4). As you study the following 28 comparisons, you will see how similar the lives of Moses and Jesus were, and the impact that both of them will have on world events in the very near future.

Moses is alive and well and back on the earth along with the prophet Elijah (Revelation 11:3-4) who was foretold that he would be sent back to the earth before the Day of the Lord (Malachi 4:4-5). They will preach and refute all the claims that the false prophet is making about the antichrist being not only the Jews, but the whole worlds messiah (Revelation 13:14-17). They will be hated and attempts will be made on their lives but they will be given supernatural protection from the Lord until their ministry is fulfilled (Revelation 11:5). Then the antichrist will be allowed to kill them (Revelation 11:7). The world will rejoice over the news and will make merry and send gifts to each other because the two men of God who tormented them are finally dead (Revelation 11:9-10). But even this victory by the devil will be short lived, for only 31/2 days later, the spirit of life will come into them from God and they will stand on their feet and ascend into heaven (Revelation 11:11-12). God wins! 31/2 years later, the antichrist and the false prophet are thrown alive into the Lake of fire (Revelation 19:20). God wins again! Then, 1,000 years later, the devil himself finally joins them along with all the people who would not serve the Lord (Revelation 20:10-15). God wins again! He always does!!

Is Jesus who is God (Titus 2:13) going to be your Saviour or Judge (Matthew 25:31-46)? Time is running out for you to make your choice. All have sinned and come short of the glory of God (Romans 3:23). Jesus paid the price for those sins when He suffered horribly (Psalm 22:14-17; Isaiah 50:5-6; 52:14) and died on the cross to make the way for us to get to heaven (John 14:6). All who call upon Him out of a pure heart (2Timothy 2:22) will receive the free gift of salvation paid for by Jesus (Romans 6:23).

Now is the time to ask Jesus into your heart before it is too late (2 Corinthians 6:2). If you are truly ready to repent of your sins and start living for God, God will come and make His abode (home) in you through the Holy Ghost (John 14:23) and you will be born again (1Peter 1:23)!
